## NO INCIDENT DURING OSCE MONITORING ON AZERBAIJANI, ARMENIAN ARMIES CONTACT LINE

The OSCE monitoring held June 8 along the contact line between the Azerbaijani and Armenian troops has passed without incidents, the Azerbaijani Defense Ministry told Trend June 8.

The monitoring was held under the mandate of the OSCE chairperson-in-office personal representative on the contact line to the east of the Kuropatkino village of Azerbaijan's Khojavand district, the ministry said.

On the Azerbaijani side, the monitoring was carried out by the field assistant of the OSCE chairperson-in-office personal representative Hristo Hristov and Peter Svedberg.

On the territories occupied and controlled by Armenian armed forces, the monitoring was carried out by the field assistants of the OSCE chairperson-in-office personal representative Simon Tiller and Jiri Aberle.

The conflict between the two South Caucasus countries began in 1988 when Armenia made territorial claims against Azerbaijan. As a result of the ensuing war, in 1992 Armenian armed forces occupied 20 percent of Azerbaijan, including the Nagorno-Karabakh region and seven surrounding districts.

The two countries signed a ceasefire agreement in 1994. The co-chairs of the OSCE Minsk Group, Russia, France and the US are currently holding peace negotiations.

Armenia has not yet implemented the UN Security Council's four resolutions on the liberation of the Nagorno-Karabakh and the surrounding regions.
