MANCHESTER, England (Reuters) - British Prime Minister Theresa May said on Tuesday she did not set red lines for the behavior of her ministers and said she welcomed different voices in her cabinet over how to secure the best Brexit deal.

The annual conference of Mays Conservative Party conference has been overshadowed by splits in her cabinet over how Britain will leave the European Union. Foreign Secretary Boris Johnson has set out his own terms for Brexit.

I dont set red lines, May told BBC television.

Leadership is about ensuring that you have a team of people who arent yes men, but a team of people of different voices around the table so that we can discuss matters, come to an agreement and then put that government view forward and that is exactly what weve done.
