The emergence of a Middle Corridor   a transit network linking Asia with European markets be way of Central Asia, the Caspian Sea and the Caucasus  b is rapidly gaining momentum as a alternative to Russia-controlled routes.
While the Trans-Caspian routes, also sometimes referred to as the China-Central Asia-West Asia Corridor, have come into their own over the past 30 years, Russias February 2022 invasion of Ukraine has prompted a significant increase in traffic over the routes.
Gaidar Abdikerimov, who heads the Trans-Caspian International Transport Route (TITR association, reports that his network now comprises 25 transport and logistics companies including ports, vessels, railways and terminals. Its members also include 11 countries: Azerbaijan, Georgia Kazakhstan, Turkey, Ukraine, Poland, Romania, Bulgaria, Lithuania, China and Singapore.
